1.	Prior consent of City required for amendments to CC&Rs regarding maintenance, levying of assessments, and City Code requirements.							
2.	Preparation of Master Plan required for any exterior modifications permitted, which must be an attachment/exhibit to CC&Rs. Any modifications to Master Plan require approval by the Community Development Department.							
3.	Project is complete as built, and no further expansions permitted without approval from the City of Mountain View Community Development Department.							
4.	Project is consistent with approved Planned Unit Development (include Planning Permit Application Nos.).							
5.	Buyer protection provisions per Section 28.68.1 of the City Code.							
6.	Home occupations are permitted in accordance with Chapter 36, Article IX, Division 11 of the City Code with all required licensing and permits obtained from the City of Mountain View.							

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7.	On-site fire protection facilities/units provided with automatic fire sprinklers.							
8.	Parking in common driveway prohibited. Fire Department access, including fire lanes, must remain unobstructed. Common driveway shall be signed, painted with red curb, and/or striped as "No Parking" or "No Parking—Fire Lane."							
9.	Parking in driveway aprons is prohibited. Garages are to be used for resident parking only. Storage in the garages is permitted only if it does not interfere with required vehicle parking.							
10.	Garages shall be provided with automatic garage door openers.							
11.	Project is required to have containers for trash, recycling, and compost. Please note the project-specific collection method and other requirements (include exhibits, if necessary) as approved by the Public Works Department.							
12.	Guest parking shall be open and accessible to all visitors.							

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13.	For attached townhouses/ rowhouses: HOA maintenance of roof, gutters, foundations, and any other shared building systems or exterior finish materials (e.g., siding, stucco, tile, trellis, etc.).							
14.	Special pavers or concrete that are removed by the City to repair, replace, or maintain the City underground utilities within private streets, driveways, and easements shall be replaced by and at the cost of the HOA.							
15.	On-site water, sanitary sewer, and storm drainage facilities shall be maintained by the HOA.							
16.	Private utility maintenance plan for on-site water, sanitary sewer, and storm drainage facilities shall be prepared by HOA.							
17.	Sanitary sewer overflow plan shall be prepared by HOA.
